Guy Fawkes and his friends had different beliefs to King James 1.
Guy Fawkes and his friends believed that Roman Catholics were treated unfairly. A plan was put together to blow up the Houses of Parliament and King James 1.
Guy Fawkes and his friends got caught and were put in prison and executed.
The King wanted to celebrate and created Bonfire Night (5 th November). To this day people still light bonfires and have fireworks on the 5 th November.
