Boycott	When you refuse to use something or do something as a form of protest.

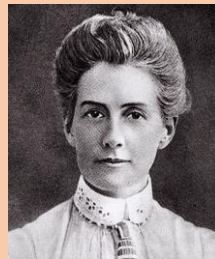
Emmeline Pankhurst



Born: 14th July 1858
Died: 14th June 1928

She was a leading women's rights activist who led the movement to win the right for women to vote.

Edith Cavell



Born: 4th December 1865
Died: 12th October 1915

Edith Cavell is famous for being a nurse in World War 1 who saved the lives of soldiers from both sides.

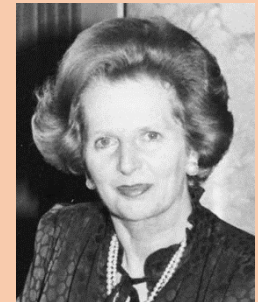
Rosa Parkes



Born: 1913 in Alabama, USA
Died: 2005

Rosa Parks was arrested in 1955 when she refused to give up her seat on a bus for a white person which was the law at the time. She campaigned for a fair society and equal rights.

Margaret Thatcher



Born: October 1925 in Grantham
Died: April 2013

Margaret Thatcher became the first female Prime Minister in British history in 1979 and also the first woman to become Prime Minister of any European country.
