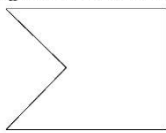


DT Knowledge Organiser – making celebratory bunting and cooking

Children will make bunting for football banners linked to celebrating the success of Boston Pilgrim Fathers (history unit of work). Children will cut shapes from fabric using a template and join fabric using a range of stitches to create aesthetically pleasing bunting.

Glamorgan sausages	
Scoop potatoes from the jackets	
Use a potato masher	
Fine snipping herbs in a jug	
Mix	
Portion and shape mixture	
Beat an egg	
Egg and crumb the sausage	

Knowledge	
Cutting accurately (paper and fabric)	
Threading needles	
Neat stitching	

Key Vocabulary		
Bunting	Decorated flag used for celebration.	
Running stitch	Stitches that do not overlap. This is a chance to improve and perfect the technique learnt in Year 1.	
Basting stitch	A stitch used to temporarily hold two pieces of fabric together.	
Template	A shape drawn (on to card or paper) to assist in cutting out (fabric).	
A design	A plan of what you want your bunting to look like before you begin making.	
Evaluating	Before you begin, evaluate bunting based on texture, usability and design. After you have finished your bunting, you must discuss if it looks like your design and how it could be improved.	



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
