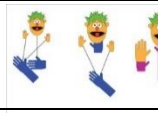
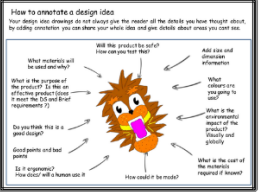
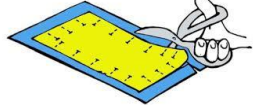


DT Knowledge Organiser – making a puppet (textiles) and cooking

In DT this term Swans children will be using fabric and sewing skills to create a puppet. These will then be used to retell a story to another class. They will build on the sewing skills learnt so far and learn some new skills. This unit of work will link to our science topic of 'light'. In cooking, children will be enjoying making pancakes for Shrove Tuesday and adding different toppings.

Knowledge	
Plan the order of work.	
Use a range of stitches to join and create an appealing and functional puppet.	
Make a template after designing puppet to aid with cutting out.	
Measure and cut with accuracy before pinning pattern together.	
Know how to assess and improve their work as they progress.	
Investigate and analyse a range of existing products.	
Consider the view of others and evaluate their work.	

Key vocabulary		
Opaque	A material that doesn't allow light to pass through it.	
Transparent	A material that allows light to pass through it.	
Annotated sketches	Labelled drawings. This might show the reader what materials are needed, how the materials are to be joined or the colours being used.	
Stiffening	Making a fabric more rigid – this can be achieved by adding stuffing or card etc to the puppet.	
Template	A shape drawn to aid cutting out.	
Seam	Where two pieces of fabric are joined.
