City	A large town. London is the capital city of England. Lincoln is a city
Town	A built up area that is larger than a village and smaller than a city. Example: Sleaford
Village	A small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops that is often in the countryside. Example: Billinghay.
England	A country in the United Kingdom. Billinghay is a village in England.
County	A county is a specific region/area of a country. Lincolnshire is a county in England.
Physical Features	Things created by nature.
Human Features	Things made by people.
Symbol	Is a picture or icon to show a feature

Features of Lincolnshire and Billinghay

Lincolnshire has many villages such as Billinghay, Ruskington, Tattershall and North Kyme. Lincolnshire has some towns such as Sleaford, Boston and Horncastle. Lincolnshire has one city, Lincoln. Some villages such as Billinghay and Ruskington are larger than others such as North and South Kyme. Billinghay has some shops, a doctors, some garages, and a school. Some villages such as Walcott do not have any shops. There are many farms in Lincolnshire and around Billinghay. London is the capital city of England. Lincolnshire is a county in England.
