Exciting places to visit in the UK

Key Vocabulary	
Physical Features	Deals with the Earth's natural features , such as mountains, deserts, rivers, and oceans.
Beach	A beach is a landform along the shoreline of an ocean, sea, lake, or river. It usually consists of loose particles, which are often composed of rock, such as sand, gravel, shingle or pebbles.
Cliff	A cliff is a steep rock face. If you stand on the edge of a cliff and peer over, you'll be able to see the waves crashing on the rocks below.
Human Features	Dealing with how human activity affects or is influenced by the earth's surface.
Port	A place with a harbour or access to water where ships can load or unload.
Harbour	a place on the coast where ships may load and unload in shelter
Population	All the people who live in one place eg a village, town or city.
Industry	Where things are made in factories.
Aerial photograph	Photographs taken from a flying object such as an aeroplane.
Key on a map	It gives you the information needed for the map to make sense
Symbols on a map	Maps often use symbols or colours to represent things, and the map key explains what they mean.
Forest	A large area covered by trees.
