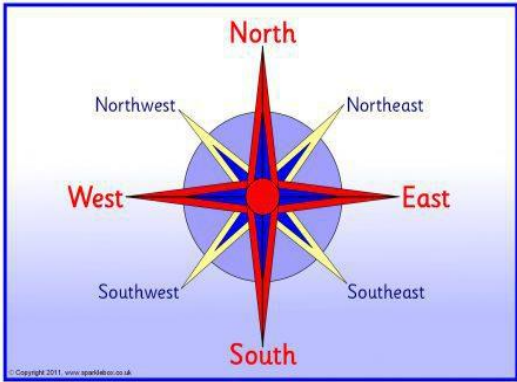


Region	that regions are an area of land that have common features. A region can be defined by physical or human features.
Relief	The way that the landscape changes in height. Lowland areas such as Lincolnshire in the East Midlands are not high above sea level and are often flat.
4 figure grid reference	A 4-figure grid reference contains 4 numbers. The first two numbers are called the easting, which is the number you would look for at the bottom of the map. The second two numbers are called the northing and represent the numbers you would look for on the side of the map.

How does climate vary in the UK?

Different regions in the UK experience slightly different climates.

Rainfall: It is generally wetter in the west (Wales, South West, North West, NI and western Scotland). The wettest places in the UK are Snowdonia (Wales), The Scottish Highlands, Lake District (NW England), Pennines (border between NW England and Yorkshire) and the moors of the South West region.

The south west and south east generally have slightly warmer summers.

How does the landscape vary in the UK?

Upland areas: Formed by glaciers. Mountainous areas. Scottish Highlands (Ben Nevis is the highest peak in the UK). Wales (Snowdonia and the Brecon Beacons). England does have some upland areas: the Pennines, Lake District (north west region) and the moors of the south west.

We live in a lowland area in the East Midlands. Other low land areas are the fens area of East Anglia (eastern England).

The darkest green areas on the map are the highest areas. The lightest colours are the lowest areas.
