Introduce 1607 first group of 150 people escaping to Holland from Fishtoft nr Boston. - Visit Boston. Guildhall and the cells where the people above were held after being arrested before trial in Lincoln. Visit St Botolph's Church where Rev John Cotton was vicar who urged his congregation to travel to the US. He set sail from Boston UK to the US in 1633. Pilgrim Trail. - Research the Pilgrim Fathers who were pilgrims from Lincolnshire who in 1608 did make it to Holland. Why did they go: they believed their Christian faith was not compatible with the C of E and wanted to live in religious freedom.
