Communication and language	Communication and language is developed throughout the year through high quality speaking and listening interactions, adults modelling language, daily group discussions, word of the week, roleplay, sharing circles, snack time, PSHE sessions, story time, singing, collective worship and sharing weekend news.						
	The development of children's spoken language underpins all 7 areas of learning and development. Children's back and forth interactions from an early age form the foundations for language and cognitive development. The number and quality of conversations that pupils have daily with adults and peers throughout the day in a language rich environment is crucial. By commenting on what children are interested in or doing, and echoing back what they say with new vocabulary added, practitioners will build children's language effectively. Reading frequently to children, and engaging them actively in stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems, and then providing them with extensive opportunities to use and embed new words in a range of contexts, will give the children opportunities to thrive. Through conversation, storytelling and roleplay, where children share their ideas with support and modelling from their teacher and sensitive questioning that invites them to elaborate, children become comfortable using a rich range of vocabulary and language structures.
